DiMaio is called "The Enter-Trainer" and for good reason. He taught a few tricks, like creating storylines by weaving in the names of the people or things you need to remember.

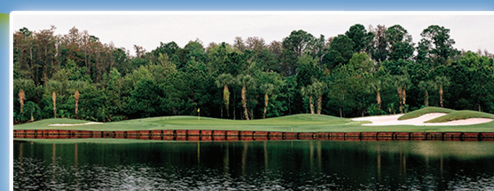
