

Nearly 300 people attended a special event on March 12 to recognize and appreciate Ram Jakhotia, his wife Rashmi, and a dedicated team of kitchen volunteers (Nita Shah, Rekha Chandra, Ramila Patel and Trushnabein) for selfless service to Tampa Bay seniors for 18 years.

"As soon as India Cultural Center was built, Ram came to ask about starting a senior group," remembers Dr. Dipak Shah on behalf of ICC management. "He has been persistent and now we are enjoying the fruits. We thank Ram and Rashmi for their dedication, hard work."

Ram Jakhotia The free ICC Seniors get-to-gather, held every third Wednesday of each month from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., has been the place where seniors meet not only to socialize and network but also listen to world-class musicians and speakers specializing in elderly needs such as finance, health care, Medicare, spirituality, diet, stress management, etc. The ICC management team has been providing free use of the Lotus Hall, kitchen facility to cook food on site, as well as offering audio/video system, tables and chairs to seniors who come from such faraway places as Sarasota, Spring Hill, Lakeland, Plant City, etc. Also, rides are arranged for seniors who do not have transportation. Dr. Jayendra Chokshi recalled the tremendous hardship Ram Jakhotia endured in India before moving to the United States. "He was born in Jayal, a small town in Rajasthan. He studied under a tree and that's how his education started. At 10, he moved to Bombay, graduated from high school, then college, with his brother's support. When they married, Ram was 17 and Rashmi was only 14 years of age."

Jakhotia wanted to be an engineer and earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering in Sangli, Maharashtra. "He came back to Bombay but couldn't find a job. Ultimately, he decided to move to the U.S. and came here via boat in 1962 with few dollars in hand. After finishing post-graduation, he got a job in New Jersey in 1965. ICC Seniors get-to-gather has grown from a handful to 250-300 people," He worked for IBM before retiring in 1997.

"A dream without a goal remains a dream only," noted philanthropist Dr. Kiran C. Patel. "It was a dream of Ram and a few friends, he persevered, persisted and now you see the outcome. Ram and Rashmi has been committed and dedicated monthly for the seniors group. They are involved in any community activity to volunteer, work without any expectations, and that's what we have to learn from them."

Jakhotia thanked ICC for offering the Lotus Hall and all its conveniences. "Seniors can make friends with other seniors when they come to Tampa to settle down in our city," he noted. "They get good food, entertainment." The Jakhotias' sons Deepak and DJ Ravidrums along with family were also present. In recognizing his parents, Ravi aptly put it, "You both are the Tom Brady and Gronk of the Indian American community!"

#### **CANCER – WHAT'S THE ANSWER? PART V: SCREENINGS ARE A WAY OUT!**

Checking for cancer in people who do not have any clinical symptoms or signs as yet is called screening. One of the biggest challenges facing our health care scientists is 'how to eliminate cancer' from the body at its onset. Cancer screening is the answer and it should be a regular part of your life.

A 70-year-old friend of mine had to get up in the middle of the night to go to the bathroom one day. This was unusual but when the same problem started happening every night, he consulted a urologist who thought his prostate was mildly enlarged. Later, a serum PSA test (Prostate Specific Antigen)

showed elevated levels, which led to further testing that revealed cancer in his prostate gland. Fortunately, it was in the early stage and he didn't have any metastatic lesions, not even local spread. Surgery followed by appropriate chemotherapy removed the entire cancer burden and he has remained free of cancer now for more than five years.

The American Cancer Society has issued cancer screening guidelines for the past 40 years that are being revised constantly. With new technologies available, we can not only detect the presence of cancer in the body but we may be able to identify even specific cancer types as well. "Get Screened" is the American Cancer Society's new campaign that encourages people to get back on track with their recommended cancer screenings. Let me give you some examples. Breast cancer, a common disease, can be detected early with periodic mammograms (X-ray of the breast) along with clinical examination (palpation of the breast). Screening mammogram is recommended once a year for all females, beginning at age 45. Lung cancer is common especially in chronic smokers or in those who have at least a 20 pack-year smoking history. (This is the number of packs of cigarettes per day multiplied by the number of years smoked.) Smokers who present with cough or have seen a tinge of blood in their sputum should have a chest X-ray and sputum analysis without delay. The American Cancer Society recommends yearly lung cancer screening in highrisk patients with low-dose computed tomography (LDCT scan) that uses less radiation, for people who are 55 and older, are in fairly good health and also meet the following conditions: 'Currently smoke or have quit in the past 15 years.' This has proven to be effective among individuals

considered to be at high risk. Cancer of the cervix, a common cancer in women all over the world, can be detected early by the 'Pap test,' done by examining cervical smear for potentially precancerous or cancerous cells in the cervix.


Colorectal cancer is another common cancer that can be detected through early screening tests that include sigmoidoscopy, colonoscopy and stool test for occult blood. In addition to detecting early cancerous lesions, these endoscopies can detect polyps, which are abnormal precancerous growths that can be removed before they turn into cancer. For those who are averse to endoscopy, a 'virtual colonoscopy' that allows the colon and rectum to be examined from outside the body using a low dose computed tomography (CT), can be used. More recently, a stool DNA test has also become available. Current recommendation is to start screening from the age of 45-50 onward.

The prostate-specific antigen (PSA) blood test, as mentioned earlier, has been used along with a digital rectal examination, for prostate cancer screening. Thankfully, many prostate cancers are not deadly but all the same, it's important make an early diagnosis. In regards to skin cancer, common in Florida, early detection starts with you. Take the time to look at your own skin to see any black moles or other new lesions are cropping up, and if so, observe them closely to see if they are getting bigger or developing symptoms like itching, bleeding, etc. And consult a dermatologist if there is any suspicion.

Several blood tests are also used to get an idea if any cancer is brewing in the body. One such is measurement of Carcinoembryonic Antigen (CEA) in the blood, which may be elevated in many types of cancers. Another one is Alfa-Fetoprotein in blood that can be elevated in liver and testicular cancers. However, these blood tests are non-specific and elevated levels do not always mean the presence of cancer.

These are just a few of the cancer screening tests in common practice. Your physician will guide you to take the right tests at the right time for early detection. Because of these screenings, cancer deaths are coming down. *To be continued ...*



#### **SCHEMING IN A COLORFUL WAY! - PART 1**

From the color of your walls to the colors of your furniture, to the artworks that decorate your spaces, they all have an impact on the mood of your home. And all are a great way to express your unique personality and taste. When decorating, sometimes it's hard to pick a color but it's helpful to know the basics of how artists choose colors for their work.

Artists carefully choose the colors they use, tending to use similar colors or color schemes throughout their work to create a sense of harmony. In this two-part series, we will discuss some of the most commonly used color schemes.

The first color scheme to discuss is monochromatic, where the artist creates different tints and shades of color but maintains the same hue.

For example, in the pieces "Undulation" and "Blue Ripple," the artist Ray Burggraf has used various shades and tints of green and blue, respectively, with lots of contrast and form to move the viewers eye across the piece.

The next is analogous, meaning the colors in this scheme are adjacent to each other on the color wheel. An example of this is red and orange or blue and purple. Artists can create interesting combinations using darker or lighter shades and tints from these analogous colors as well.

For example, in "Candy Apple Pink," the analogous colors used are blue and purple. In "Heartland Roo," yellow and green and blue and purple are used. Another scheme is complimentary colors, or colors that are opposite each other on the color wheel. For example, blue and orange are complimentary colors, as well as red and green.

Mark Messersmith uses vibrant blues and oranges in in his artwork "Study For: In search of Shadow Land."

One needs to first understand the rules of colors to use them efficiently or gracefully break those rules to design a harmonious living environment. Look for part two in my next article about, split complimentary, triatic, and tetradic color schemes.

But no matter what the scheme, choose artwork that speaks to you. There is not a right or wrong, whether you like monochromatic, analogous, complimentary, split complimentary, triadic, or tetradic color scheme, the color scheme should resonate with you just like music would.





#### **STOP BUILDING A RESUME!**

By ROBERT LEVINE



"What extracurricular activities do I need to get into a top school?"

Um ... it doesn't work that way. If it did, I would write a book with checklists about building a resume for college, and I'd become an instant millionaire.

Yet we always hear what you're "supposed" to do. Go to a summer program at a prestigious university (which is usually counter-productive for admissions purposes). Do a personal project (which often looks like a manufactured effort). Start a charity (which is a red flag because it requires the assistance of adults).

This may seem controversial, but I am so tired of young people acting like they're going to change the world because they did something while collecting required community service hours. If you're actually going to change the world, you would have already started changing the world. Ask me about our student who – at age 11 – started an information campaign about human trafficking that led to a shelter for emancipated sex slaves. Before she graduated high school, they had saved and rehabilitated over 50 girls who had been kidnapped, enslaved and used.

And you think that serving food once a week for a few months makes you a world-changer?

As another example, have you ever heard of Greta Thunberg? She started trying to change the world at age 15. I doubt that her original inspiration for speaking out about climate change was to be nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize, but it happened.

Stop focusing on building a resume. Build a person. Do your best, be your best, and the resume will develop organically.

No, there is no extracurricular checklist for college success. However, there are some "minimums" if you wish to impress admissions representatives.

First, somehow, somewhere, have some leadership on your resume. In reviewing a list of activities, our eyes naturally search for words like "President" and "Founder." Even the title "Vice President" works pretty well (being "second" certainly did not hurt my application to Harvard). In the uber-competitive world of college admissions, the best candidates have leadership positions. You should too.

Second, perform some meaningful community service. That should not be hard to achieve. After all, students are usually required by curriculum

or scholarship opportunities to perform a certain number of service hours. But can you imagine reading an applicant's resume that does not demonstrate any form of philanthropy? Just do it.

Third – and this is something that many people neglect – use your body, not just your mind. Whether it's competitive athletics, club sports, an exercise regime or dog walking, do something physical. Why is this important? Not only does a healthy body lead to a healthy mind, but the universities have identified that those who are physically active during college donate three times more money as alumni than those who are not physically active. Hmm ...

So what should you do? Do whatever you want, but do it well. Yes, be active and impactful in your school clubs and outside group activities, but definitely do YOUR thing. In our experience, the students who achieve the best success in admissions have one consistent attribute: they are "do-ers." Recognize what you already enjoy doing, and do more of that. Go hard, go deep, be great.

Now here is some important advice for parents. No helicoptering. No Tiger Moms. Pulling and pushing your child does not develop a proactive mindset. Don't tell them what to do.

Show them what to do.


As an adult, be a role model, not a dictator. Even more than what we say, what we do trains young people. They copy our behaviors, good and bad. Be good. Be happy, healthy, kind and productive. Are you serving the community? Are you involved in any organizations? Are you following a healthy lifestyle?

Perhaps, you have heard the phrase "Physician, Heal Thyself." Or maybe you prefer "Be the Change." If you aren't that kind of person, why do you expect your child to understand those values? Because you say so? No, we all have to walk the walk.

Please, stop trying to navigate a path to success. If you want to be truly great, when do you want to begin?

We recommend starting now. This day. This minute. This moment. Now.

Introduced over a decade ago, the GMC Terrain has stood the test of time despite fierce competition in the compact SUV segment. Available as a front-wheel or all-wheel drive, the hands-on and robust Terrain is a superb blend of performance and style. For 2022, an AT4 (All-Terrain four-wheel drive) model with a front steel skid plate has been introduced.

"These Americans" (210 pages; \$17) by Jyotsna Sreenivasan; published by Minerva Rising Press (www. minervarising.com)

Can Indian Americans hold on to their Indian culture while still trying to find a footing in the country? Written simply and elegantly, eight stories and a novella tackle the dilemma. In "Mirror," an Indian woman giving birth in a hospital where her husband is a resident doctor reminisces about "nursing homes" back in India "where ladies go to have

By Nitic babies." And that too is a lady doctor. "But here they think nothing of having a man look at that part of a lady and put his fingers in and

everything. It's disgusting. But what to do? Here I am in America." "At Home" tackles the story of Amiya whose teacher asks her to represent India at the school's international fair. But the young girl is reluctant. "She had worked so hard to be normal. At school, she often forgot she had brown skin and black hair and that she ate strange food at home. How could she march in the parade and remind all the kids that she was not normal?" In "Dreams," when Malini's brother Pramod is suspended for bad behavior in school and counseling is recommended, his father raises questions. "These Americans are always running to counselors, and still they have problems ... Indians are different. We handle our own problems

within the family. And in our family, we do not have such serious problems that we need to tell strangers about them." "Mrs. Raghavendra's Daughter" tackles the subject of lesbianism after a widow discovers that her daughter Anjana and Susan are more than mere friends living together. "She could allow Anjana to be who she is, and it wouldn't matter what anyone - her friends, the relatives in India – said or thought," writes the author. In the novella "Hawk," mother/daughter relationship come to the forefront as an elderly doctor facing Alzheimer's reveals a lifelong secret to her daughter, a sixth-grade English teacher, through several letters.

"Are you writing for me?"

"It is for anyone who wants to read it. So they will know

"No Presents Please" (272 pages; \$16.95) by Jayant Kaikini, translated from Kannada by Tejaswini Niranjana; published by Catapult (www.

But "No Presents Please" works thanks to one of 16 stories in this collection that is about a young factory worker Asavari and her boyfriend glancing at wedding invitations under a Ghatkopar overpass. She asks owner of the platform bookstall who is helping write out the invitation, "Nowadays people write 'Your blessings are our gift' and 'No presents please'—should we



write those too?" "That's a rich-people style, my daughter," said Tripathi. "That's not for us. If anyone gives you something lovingly, don't refuse it. Yours is a new household, you'll need everything ..." he said.

For laughs, "Dagadu Parab's Wedding Horse" will have the reader in splits till the very end. When the bridegroom's horse bolts during the procession, mayhem follows. "From Goshala Road, the horse went into the vast St. Pais playing field, galloped through a herd of cows, crossed two or three cricket pitches and a small wall, slipped past a petrol station, and thus emerged

onto the Agra highway, running between enormous vehicles, trucks and double-decker buses." In a sad tale about the closing of Royal Opera House and a lost thermos, the author vividly brings the surrounding areas to life: "The night streets, the local trains, the colorful curtains of the rooms of the naachwalis that one could see from Kennedy Bridge, the Anantashram rice-and-fish plate, the round aluminum boxes containing the film reels—there were the strands of his web. Indranil has had no reason to disturb the warmth of this web." In "Interval," a cinema attendant and his girlfriend plan to run away and take the first step. But both have an epiphany of sorts at the last minute and separate ways, "... now begin to think of each other in their journeys, so as to keep the fear away." When a bus driver is refused leave to visit his village for Ganesh Utsav holidays, he makes the risky move of stealing the doubledecker and taking off. #### EB-5 REFORM AND INTEGRITY ACT OF 2022

The EB-5 Regional Center Program, which had expired in June 2021, was finally reauthorized as part of the Omnibus Spending Bill signed into law by President Biden on March 15, 2022. This provides relief for the thousands whose EB-5 petitions and applications were still in process when the prior authorization expired. Entitled the EB-5 Reform and Integrity Act of 2022, the bill revises many aspects of the EB-5 landscape. It will take time to for U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to implement all the changes. Some of the main points are highlighted in this article. Some

provisions took immediate effect allowing USCIS to process applications on hold while others will be taking effect over time.

#### **The Required Amount**

As part of the renewal, the investment thresholds for immigrant investors have increased — in targeted employment areas (TEAs) from \$500,000 to \$800,000, and in non-TEAs from \$1,000,000 to \$1,050,000. The Regional Center Program is extended for five years and all applications filed during the five years would continue to be processed even if further extensions are not approved or delayed.

#### **Adjustment of Status**

Investors and family already legally in the U.S. and eligible for a visa number may concurrently file applications for adjustment of status (avoiding consular visa processing) along with or while awaiting adjudication of the investor's I-526 petition. This is a big change because applicants do not have to wait the months and years it took USCIS to process the I-526. EB-5 investors are also now eligible to use INA section 245(k), forgiveness of up to 180 days of status violations when they apply for adjustment.

#### Statutory Definition of Targeted Employment Areas and Associated **Visa Set-Asides**

A significant change to the RC Program is the inclusion of a statutory definition for TEAs, which include high unemployment areas, rural projects and infrastructure projects. Under the new law, TEAs qualify for both the lower investment level and visa set-asides. High unemployment areas are areas that can only be designated by DHS and where the unemployment rate in a given census tract (or contiguous census tracts) is no less than 150 percent of the national average unemployment rate. Rural projects are those that are outside a metropolitan statistical area, or within the outer boundary of any city of town with a population of 20,000 or more. Importantly, under the new law, Department of Homeland Security is obligated to "prioritize" processing of investor applications for rural projects. Infrastructure projects are a "capital investment project" that must be a "public works project" administered by a

"government entity" that contracts with a regional center.

There is a reserve of visas set aside annually for TEAs — 20 percent of visas available under the RC Program each year will be reserved for immigrant investors in rural projects; 10 percent will be reserved for investors in DHSdesignated high unemployment areas; and 2 percent of the visas will be reserved for immigrant investment in infrastructure projects. An additional highlight from the reformed RC Program is that any unused visas from the above-referenced 32 percent reserve that remain unused from any given year will carry over to the following fiscal year, creating potential for a greater investment pool in a given year, depending on the timing of the project being considered and the number of unused visas from the prior year.

#### **Security and Integrity Measures**

In an effort to increase integrity and security throughout the RC Program, regional centers must now adhere to a set of statutory requirements that have been more robustly defined. USCIS now has clear authority to deny regional center business plans where applicants have engaged in fraud, criminal conduct or where a plan would threaten national security, and no person convicted of a crime in the last 10 years, or civil fraud resulting in liability of more than \$1 million can be involved in the EB5 program. USCIS is now also obligated to audit each regional center at least once every five years and conduct site visits, and regional centers are obligated to submit annual investment activities statements to USCIS. Failure to submit these statements or submitting inaccurate statements can result in USCIS imposing civil penalties on a regional center, suspension of a regional center's ability to operate and even permanent "debarment" of a regional center. In addition, new "source-of-funds" requirements will ensure investor funds are from legitimate sources. The reauthorizing language also specifies that U.S. securities laws apply to all aspects of EB5 offerings.

#### **Special Rules on Pooled Investments**

Going forward, all I-526 filings with pooled investments (two or more EB-5 investors) must be sponsored by a RC and meet lots of new RC requirements including the RC's filing of an exemplar about the project (not required to wait for exemplar approval before I-526 filing). Simple, "direct" pooled investments will not be allowed, even among friends who would all be active in the business. And solo investors will not be able to use indirect arrangements and indirect job creation even if sponsored by an RC.

#### Conclusion

The new law is a welcome relief for many. The provisions have far-reaching consequences and new investors should be cautious and wait for USCIS to issue guidance and implement the new program.
